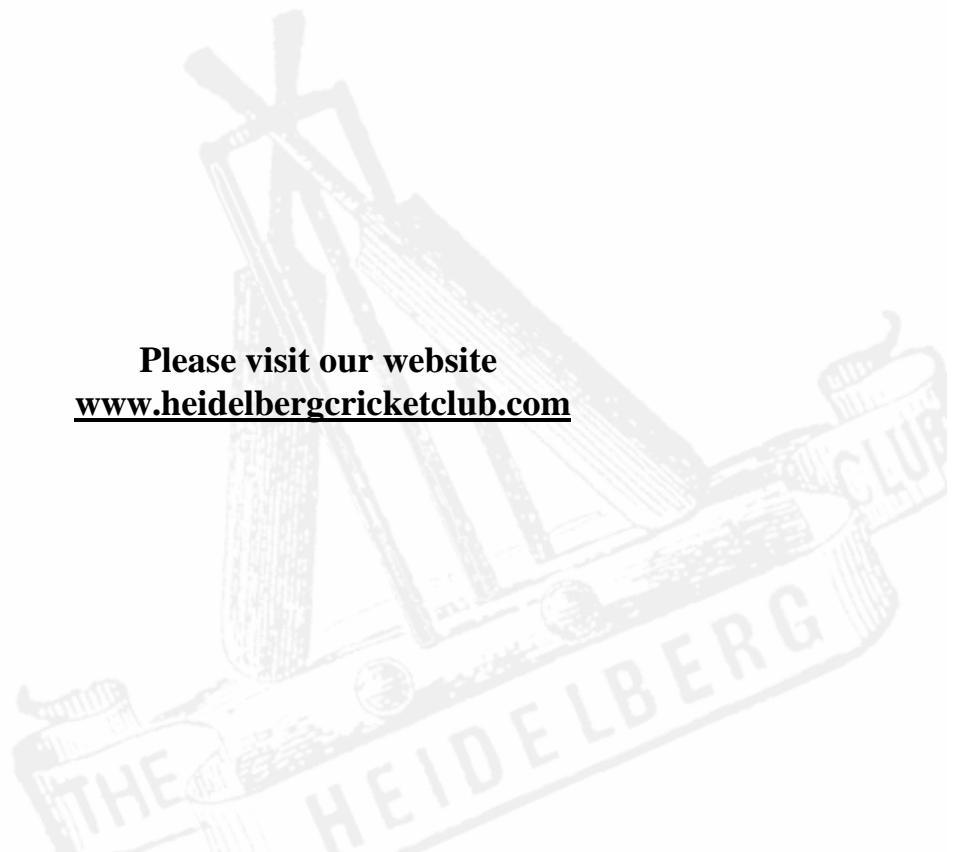

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Well what a year! To celebrate our 150th season and to record premierships in the three most important grades is really a dream come true.

After our disastrous campaign in 05/06, the bar was set very high this season as we needed to redeem ourselves as a club and as a First XI and we did that in emphatic style. It gave me an enormous amount of personal satisfaction to again see us as the number one club in the HDCA and to record premierships in BOTH the U/16s and U/14s was icing on the celebratory cake.

Let me talk about the juniors for a moment. Our last decade of success has now resulted in 7 Grand Final appearances for four flags. This achievement has been fuelled by players who played their junior cricket with this club. This year's First Grade premiership team comprised NINE players who played junior cricket with Heidelberg. Perhaps only Banyule could boast a similar number and it is absolute proof that you do not buy premierships you have to 'grow' them.

I laugh when I hear outsiders comment about how much we pay players. If only they knew. For the record we pay NO players whatsoever apart from the A-Grade Captain and any coach or coaches we choose to employ. The rest don't play for nothing, they play to be part of a team and a club who are driven by the desire to succeed, to share special days like March 31st and be a part of an extraordinary club.

I would like to personally thank and congratulate Grant Jordan on captaining our A-Grade premiership side. After years of hounding from me, Grant returned to the club after Russell stepped down and he led with conviction and determination.

As a 17 year old Grant said to me he would return to the club one day to finish his cricket career at Heidelberg. To stand there after the game with Jordo and hold up the E.C. Jack Shield as First Grade Premiers was a moment I will never forget.

I talk a lot about the 'spirit' of Heidelberg. It is difficult to put into words, it is perhaps more of an expectation of success than anything else that can at times create undue pressure on players. It also provides a critical benchmark for the club to aspire to and I congratulate all the premiership players this year.

I would like to highlight Brad Grindal's performances in the finals series. To make 100 and take 4 wickets in the Semi Final against a determined Rosanna was a remarkable effort. To back that up with a critical 41 and then 5 wickets in the Grand Final was legendary stuff. Well done Rack. To Hunts whose 93 was probably overshadowed by Brad's performances you set the game up for our middle order. And to Cash who showed his class on the last day with a super 50 n.o. well done to you too.

Brad's dream finals run began before the First Grade Grand Final as he also managed and coached our U/16 Gold team. Well done on a terrific result and for laying the foundation of future First Grade Heidelberg premiership players.

To Russell Kelly and his helpers in the U/14 Gold division what a thriller of a game and brilliant Grand Final win. Having looked after these boys for three or so years prior to this year my heart rate was flying in those dying overs hoping they would realise their ultimate goal. To see the joy on Maurice Cocco's face after Anthony (and Patrick) did such a wonderful job, well, that is what cricket is all about.

Okay onto some thanks. To our leadership group of Jordo, Robbo and Brad well done on a fantastic year – a premiership year. Robbo, it gives me great pleasure to say that you are now a Heidelberg Cricket Club First Grade premiership coach. It is richly deserved. You should have come to Heidelberg 15 years ago.

To Robbo and Bluey on captaining the Second and Fourth XI's so well with such a high turnover of players was a terrific result. Bluey has at this stage announced his retirement and we thank him immensely for all the work he has done with the juniors and lower grades over the last 5 or so years.

To John Hand who assumed the Junior Manager role I say a huge thankyou. You made my life easier with such a well organised junior program. To coach one of the U/14 teams while your son played in the higher division was a great sacrifice by you but to see Mitchell as part of the premiership team proved you made the right decision.

Brad Grindal looked after both U/16 teams at training but had great help from Keith Nihill who early in the season realised we had little parental support in this area and kindly stepped in to assist - thankyou Keith.

To Steve Cashen and the U/12s a tough year with a young side going into the highest division but I am sure they learnt plenty this year and will be better players for it in the long run.

To David Mattosonii and the Kookaburras well done on a really great season. David is a terrific coach, patient and understanding and we look forward to a long association. I know the parents really enjoyed having you there this year and they too enjoyed themselves. Thanks also to Pete Knight who I know helped David out enormously during the season.

To the committee - a big thankyou and a just reward on March 31st for your work throughout the season. To the two Craig's - Ladd and Stevens thankyou for filling the roles of Treasurer and Secretary once again. To Russell Gardner who looked after our social functions and also merchandise well done on a really huge job of managing these areas in our 150th year.

To the rest of the committee Damien Noonan, Warren Chapman, Steve Cashen and John Frazier thanks for putting in when you needed to. To the girls who always supported their men thanks for coming down and playing a big part in our success. Congratulations to Nichole and Warren and to Damien and Sarah on the birth of their children during the season. A big year for you two.

On the financial side of things the club has never been in a healthier position. This year we had full control of the bar operations and increased turnover and subsequently profit by approximately 80% on the previous year. We now finally have a platform where we can invest money back into the club and its facilities to ensure the place is even better for all members.

Apart from the premierships the highlight of the year was the 150th celebrations at the Old England Hotel. It was a super night with many past players and their partners attending.

You will read more thanks in later reports but lastly I would like to say thank you to my family, Clare Emma, Hayley and Lachlan for supporting my passion for the club and putting with all those times when 'I just have to nick down to the club for a minute'.

We have just set the bar a little higher again and remember this - it has been near on 10 years since we won back to back flags. Can it be done?

150 – A Remarkable Innings

The President's 150th anniversary speech at the Old England Hotel on February 17th 2007.

Since our first game against Collingwood at the MCG on January 1st 1857 the club began a remarkable journey of success and a pivotal role in the community. This very room we are standing in has major historical significance as this was the place where visiting teams came to stay when they played Heidelberg, the 'country' team of Metropolitan Melbourne.

In fact 150 years ago ovals we know today did not have pavilions or social clubs. The local hotels were the meeting places for before, during and after match functions. Reading a piece from a local publication dated December 26th 1857 a *Mrs, Denton 'mine hostess' of the Old England is laying vast quantities of the things consumable and a great day may be expected by all'*

The club's very first oval was located in small hollow below the Old England Hotel probably about where the Courtney and Patterson dealership is now located. Clubs such as Melbourne, Collingwood, St.Kilda, Richmond and Coburg would venture out to leafy Heidelberg, players and presidents in coaches and the rest on horseback.

Through the late 1800's and early 1900's the club was blessed with strong, highly respected administrators who ensured the club was well managed. Names like The Honourable Frederick Powlett who became President on September 23rd 1858. Fred was not only Victoria's First Commissioner of Crown Land he also happened to be the founder of the Melbourne Cricket Club 20 years earlier. These men laid the foundation for future generations to enjoy the reverence and respect of which the club is held in today.

Surely one the great players in the history of the club was a fellow by the name of Thomas Wills who captained Victoria for near on 20 years in the late 1800s. He was the last fast bowler to ever captain the club. Yes, this is the same Tom Wills who is credited as being the founder of Australian Rules Football.

The rich and proud history stems from some key underling values the most important being that at senior level we play cricket to win. Other clubs can play socially but we like to win and then enjoy the social benefits later.

I would like to acknowledge and thank all of you here tonight for the contribution no matter how big or small you have made to the Heidelberg Cricket Club. Each of you represent a thread in this magnificent fabric that started its life in blue and white, became blue and gold and has now evolved to black and gold. Just a subtle change of colour but a very significant one – more about that later.

I would like to acknowledge and thank the 20 or so Life Members we have in the room with us tonight. You don't deserve the honour of Life membership unless your service to the club is lengthy and most importantly above and beyond the call of duty. We have you people especially to be thankful for.

I would like to acknowledge and thank the past office bearers of the club. Since the Second World War we too have been blessed with strong administrations that carry on the values of the club and instill them in young players and members of the club.

I would like to acknowledge the past Presidents with us here tonight in Peter Laydon, Trevor Skerry, and Gordon Richmond as well as those who who have fulfilled the roles of Secretary and Treasurer. Thankless jobs but vital at the same time.

I would particularly like to thank Trevor Skerry who in the late eighties and early 90's began assembling and collating past club scorebooks which have been under my house for the best part of 10 years. We will carry on Trevor's work and get those books and history updated and we will for the first time in the Club's history have proper honour boards by the start of next season. That is a promise.

I would like to thank and acknowledge the Jordan family and the role they have played in this cricket club.

We are all aware of the tragedy that struck on July 21 2004 when Dumpy and Joy were killed. The legacy that Dumpy left is his spirit and his love and passion for the Club. I acknowledge Dumpy and Joy's daughters, Cathy and Joanne and their partners who were with us earlier tonight.

I would also like to acknowledge the late Bruce Jordan and his contribution to the cricket club in what was a very short life. Today, this club's office bearers all played junior cricket with the club, under the tutelage of Bruce who like Dumpy instilled the core club values in us in a very early age.

Between Myself, Craig Stevens and Craig Ladd we have played over 800 games with Heidelberg and played a role in administering the club for a combined total of approximately 42 years. We acknowledge the Jordan influence and thank Barb, Glenn, Grant and Gavin for the role they have played in the history of the club.

One of the great highlights of my Presidency is that after some 15 years of continually asking, this year, Grant returned to the First XI as captain and I can't help but think that is what this club is all about, developing outstanding juniors who go onto to bigger and better things but offering enough enjoyment along the way that they feel compelled to return and assist the club. I hope that Grant can get back and play a role in avenging last year's defeat and returning the EC Jack shield back to its rightful home.

I would like to acknowledge Keith Nihill and his wife Trish who are here with us tonight. Keith is still playing the odd game with us and is currently our oldest player. This year Keith put his hand up to manage one of the U/16s of which his grand nephew is playing. I think Keith has now played with four generations of the Nihill family at Heidelberg. A stellar performance indeed.

I would like to acknowledge all the Club Champions in the room, past captains, coaches and premiership players. Fortunately there are too many of you to mention individually. I would also like to thank the junior coaches over the years; people like Ian Walker, Trevor Skerry, those sort of people who have donated tens of thousands of hours of their time helping develop great cricketers and sound people.

And I would like to thank those who made a great effort to get here tonight, Graeme and Carol Monaghan and John Prowse all the way from Queensland and there are many others who travelled from afar to be with us here tonight. In closing I would like to give you a snapshot of where the club is at today.

Some 10 years ago we changed one of colours from dark blue to black to align ourselves more closely with the HFC. Co-incidentally at that same time we began our climb back up the ladder as a powerhouse cricket club in the North East of Melbourne. We have now played in the HDCA A-Grade finals for the last nine consecutive years. Of those nine years we have played in 6 A-Grade Finals for 3 premierships. This year we intend to arrest this 6 – 3 imbalance.

Today we field four strong senior teams and seven junior sides - two U/16s, two U/14s, two U/12s and a Milo Cricket Program with some 30 kids playing.

Off field our relationship with the HFC is the model for councils and other clubs to emulate. There is a common 'Heidelberg' understanding between the clubs with a respect for the rich history and the desire for success. Financially we have never been better off than we are today.

I thank you for coming tonight I know you will enjoy yourself and I would like to remind you; don't be a stranger. If there is one chink in our armour it is the fact we don't see too many past players at the club. Please drop in any Saturday afternoon, watch some great local cricket and raise a glass to the past and to the future.

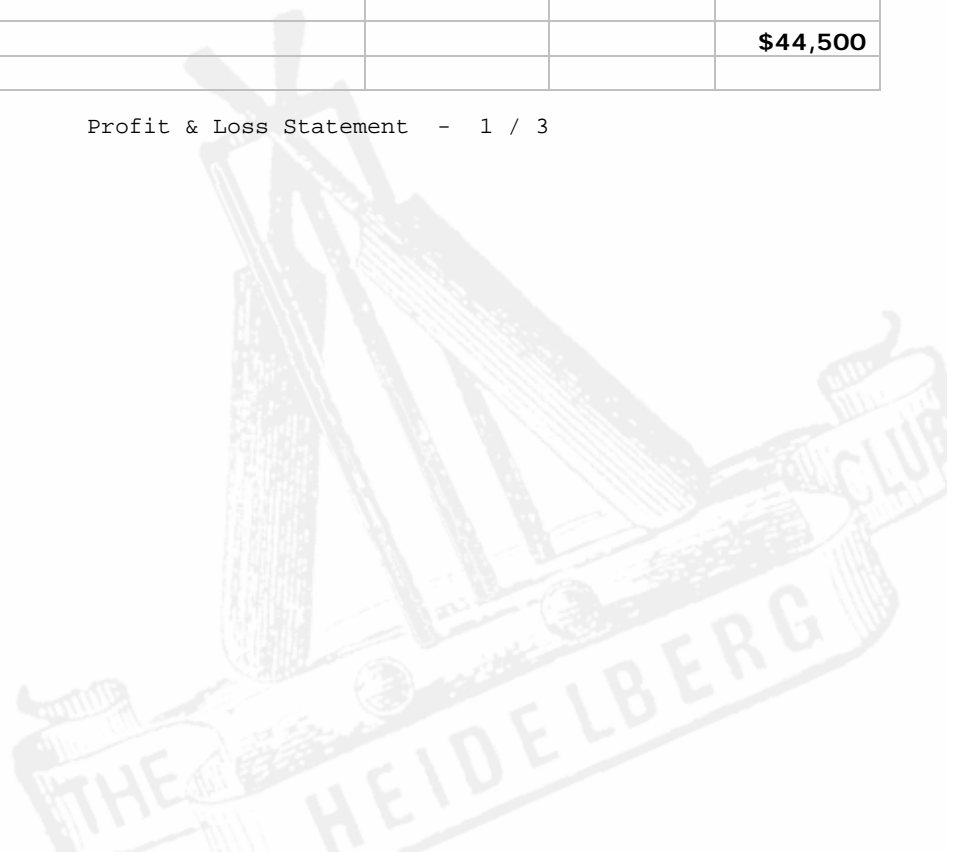

Profit & Loss Statement - 3 / 3

Explanatory Notes

- All social functions' bar takings and expenses are grossed up into the overall Bar category. Most revenue from social functions comes through the bar, and this revenue is reflected in Bar Income.
- Just after the commencement of the 2006-07 season, the cricket club assumed full control of the Bar operation (stocking, staffing, cleaning, till management, banking, etc) as well as responsibility for all clubroom utility expenses (electricity, gas, water, telephone) and room cleaning expenses.
- As a general rule, Merchandising not geared towards profit. The selling of club apparel (playing shirts, caps, '150' polos, etc) aims solely to cover costs.
- The income we expect to derive from existing stock-on-hand in years henceforth (i.e. merchandise - predominately player apparel) is not included in this 2006-07 income. We hold approximately \$1900 worth of stock based on cost.

Highlights

- A profit of \$8,419 was achieved for season 2006-07.
- Under the new bar management arrangement with the Football Club, bar profit increased by 67% compared to the previous season (\$12,060 to \$20,200 using a like-for-like comparison).
- Marked increase in player subscriptions revenue - 94% of registered players fully financial.
- The club has a healthy stock of merchandise (player shirts & other apparel) which should generate income next year.

COACH'S REPORT

What a superb way to celebrate a historical year in the history of the Heidelberg Cricket Club. A century and a half old and fielding the 2006-07 First Grade premiership side which managed a compelling victory in the final. Throw in the First Grade One-Day premiership for a third consecutive year and victories in the U/16 Gold and U/14 Gold we capped off a stunning season.

No club can operate without the many who give of their time and help out in any various situations from President Dean Turner and the committee to the junior co-ordinator in John Hand, all junior coaches and assistants, to clubmen like Ray and Gary who lent a hand all year, and finally to Brian Saunders who is what the club is all about.

This year the club fielded junior sides in the Kookaburras, U/12, U/14 and U/16 levels. This is the future of the club and it only happens with the support from parents and senior players prepared to help out during the year. To all the other boys that played in the junior levels this year well done and look forward to another season where the next win is just around the corner.

This season saw a new Coaching panel in place with myself as Senior Coach, Brad Grindal as Assistant Coach and Grant Jordan as First Grade Captain. Congratulations to both Grant and Brad on achieving such a great result in First Grade winning both the One-Day and season proper premierships! Certainly the job of coaching and running training nights was made easy this year with the input from Brad and Grant. Thanks to all grade captains - Grant, Dean and Paul for their help and to Martin Legge for his assistance during the season.

We came very close to getting all four senior sides into the finals for the first time in many years but unfortunately had to settle with three, the Third Grade missing out at the last hurdle. Bluey has done a great job in Fifth Grade with so many different players each week and certainly pushed the juniors at every chance so it was pleasing for them to play in a final and gain some valuable experience. Calvin Plowright had a terrific year winning that competition's best player award. Well done Calvin.

Unfortunately Third Grade missed the finals, but again Dean managed many juniors and high turnover during the year. Good seasons to both Dean and Rajat Singh, along with consistent efforts from John Clarke and several of the young juniors, saw Dean's side fall just one game short of finals action. Well done to Rajat on winning the competition batting average.

In my side we were fortunate to see some good young players come through and added with some experienced campaigners were able to play finals cricket. Result not so good but credit to Craig Stevens, Tim James and Matt Creak on solid & consistent seasons.

To the premiership team congratulations to all who made contributions through the season -all players have a hand in winning premierships. This side was led brilliantly by Grant until injured and then Brad with a little assistance from Stephen Cashen and then finally back with Jordo to finish off the year. Great seasons had by many in particular Stephen Cashen, Craig Hunter, Brad and Grant with the bat and Brad, Craig Ladd and Damien Noonan with the ball. Special mention goes to Damien for winning the competition bowling award and very thoroughly deserved it is and to my coaching partner in Brad who had an absolute ripper of a year, captaining the one-day premiership and man of the match honours in both one-day and season proper finals - 460 runs and 38 wickets a well deserved Club Champion!

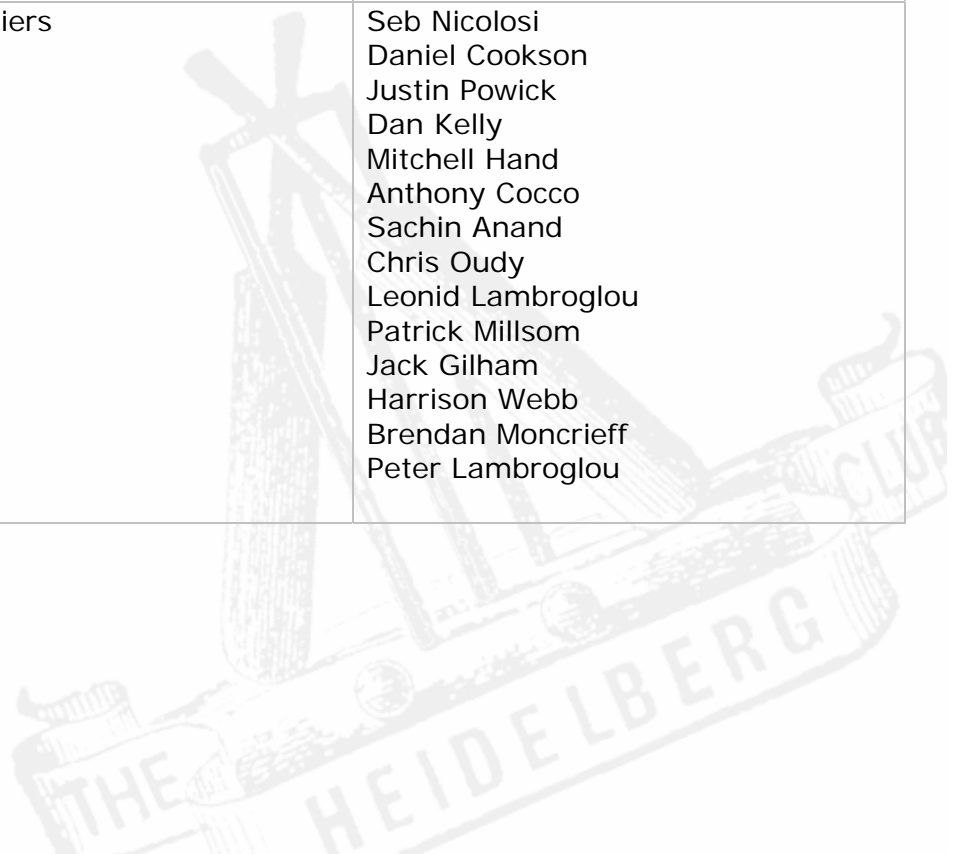

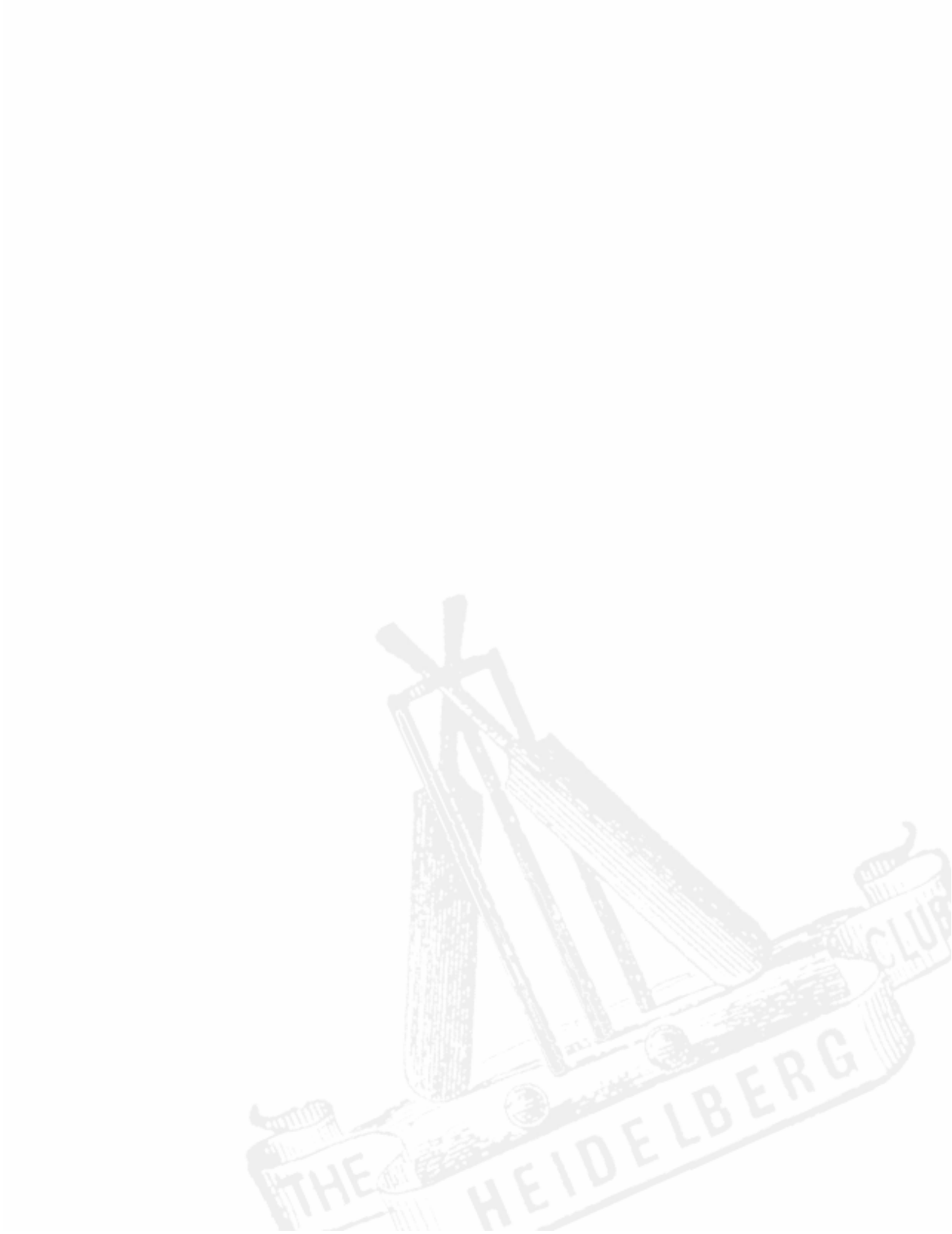

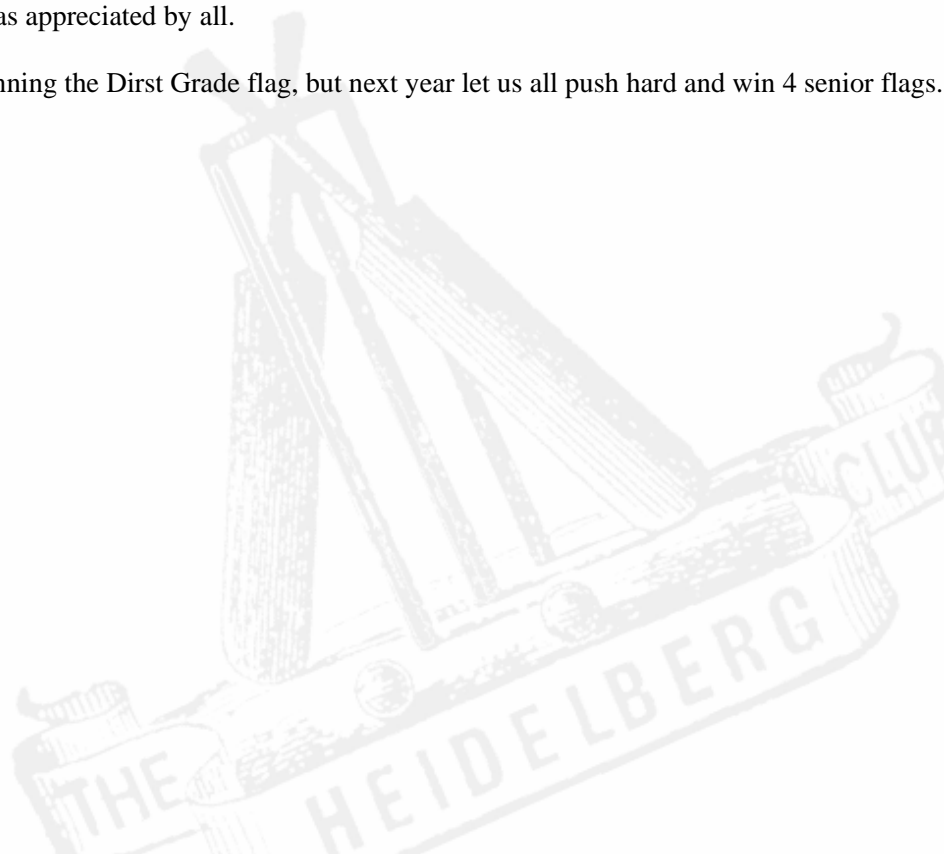

Appendix I

Trophy Winner Eligibility

Player must be a fully financial member of the Heidelberg Cricket Club.

First Grade Qualification Requirements -:

Batting - Minimum of 7 innings and 200 runs. Otherwise most runs.

Bowling - Minimum of 500 balls. Otherwise most wickets.

All Other Senior Grades Qualification Requirements -:

Batting - Minimum of 5 innings and 200 runs. Otherwise most runs.

Bowling - Minimum of 5 innings and 300 balls. Otherwise most wickets.

U/16 & U/14 Qualification Requirements -:

Batting - Minimum of 5 innings and 150 runs. Otherwise most runs

Bowling - Minimum of 5 innings and 180 balls. Otherwise most wickets.

U/12 Qualification Requirements -:

Batting - Minimum of 5 innings and 100 runs. Otherwise most runs

Bowling - Minimum of 5 innings and 120 balls. Otherwise most wickets.

Team Notations

In season 2006-07 the Heidelberg Cricket Club, in its 150th year, fielded four senior teams and five junior teams.

In the seniors, the club's 1st XI, 2nd XI, and 3rd XI participated in the HDCA's First, Second, and Third Grades respectively whilst its 4th XI competed in the HDCA's Fifth Grade competition. Throughout this document, Heidelberg's 4th XI team is notated as "Fifth Grade" for this reason.

In the juniors, as a general guide, the club's first year players in their age-group participated in the HDCA's Green competition, whilst second year players competed in the Gold competition. For the U/12 team, we elected to participate in the HDCA's Gold competition because it offered 2-day matches.

Additionally, the club once again conducted a 'Milo Cricket' program throughout the season. This 16 week program teaches children (aged 4 through 9) the skills of the game through various training drills and doesn't involve a fixtured competition. In 2006-07, some 30 children participated in the HCC's Milo Cricket-Have-A-Go program which was managed by Craig Stevens, Craig Ladd, and Russell Gardner.
