- Continued playing under Ian Walker until he retired in 1992

- Playing highlight was in the early 80's when he took 4/1 in an over to win the game when the other team needed only 7 runs to win with 4 wickets in hand and plenty of overs.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The Heidelberg Cricket Club has existed for 155 years because it is built on a solid foundation of principles and values, the most significant being an expectation of success.

Success can be measured in many ways the most obvious being the pennants that hang in the club rooms and the silverware in the cabinets.

Over many years I have said that we exist to win A – Grade flags and that is true, but there is so much more to what we are as a club that our success can be defined in many ways.

Let me first touch on the Grand Final. To lose by the very barest of margins was incredibly disappointing, particularly against Rosanna, a club who I consider to be a very well run club with similar values and principles to ours. That hurt deeply.

I will not go into great depth about our finals performance but it would be remiss of me not to mention Damien Noonan's heroics in the semi-final to virtually bowl us into a Grand Final in a stunning 2 over spell. And of course our Captain Brad Grindal's incredible innings that almost, almost got us over the line. Spectators and more importantly players should take a great deal from witnessing the work of two great servants of the club. Two decorated veterans with a will to win that cannot be ignored.

Players are remembered in many ways but there is no better way than to recall brilliant performances in finals, when the pressure is right on and you are expected to rise to the occasion.

Those two did in 2011/2012, who will it be during the course of 2012/2013?

The loss to Rosanna was hard to fathom but more disappointing for me though was the fact that our 6 players under the age of 22 were unable to experience the joy of winning an A-Grade Grand Final. Like all our members we hope that day will come for all our players, but still, to get so close and not collect the prize was difficult to digest.

I would like to make special mention of our club coach Russell Gardner who took on the role for a second time in recent years. Russell is an outstanding man of great integrity and a deep thinker of the game. He took the club to a new level in terms of training and discipline and preparation and I have no doubt that is what got us over the line as a team in the semi and so bloody close in the Granny. Thank you Russ, you have left the club in better shape than it was and it is great that you will remain involved as an important mentor to Brad.

Despite what the wider cricket community think we are an amateur club.

It is one of our great strengths and always has been, because money does not cloud the reason we exist – it does not influence or determine friendships, it does not alter expectations, it means we are totally transparent and on an equal footing with each other. The temptation to go down the professional path is strong, however I urge everyone to think of the consequences of heading down that road. It can change a club forever.

On field is just one measure of success. This year in particular was a great one off the field with a record turnover and significant operating profit, thanks largely to the efforts of John Gilham, Damien Noonan and Craig Bassett on the sponsorship front. This year we recorded a 1,300% increase in sponsorship revenue. An extraordinary result in a tough economic climate.

We continue to see our youth develop into outstanding young men, well rounded, well respected and great company to be with. These young men are about to embark on Generation NEXT and having personally been through two of those 'generations' it's an amazing feeling to be riding the wave of success, shoulder to shoulder with close mates who you have known since childhood.

I cannot think of a more fruitful time in the club's history where we have so many talented 15 to 25 year olds. The challenge for us is to manage all these players correctly, to see them flourish as players and develop as quality people so that they can take the club forward for the next 30 or 40 years.

I would like to thank all the committee for their hard work this year. We are blessed to have more people than we ever have put up their hand and be willing to contribute in the running and administration of this great cricket club. I would particularly like to thank Bluey who is an extraordinary asset for the club whose tireless work behind the bar and cleaning the place has contributed greatly to our record financial result.

More quiet achievers are the Balcombes, Tony and Deb who this year assumed the role of Junior Managers. I thank them both for their fantastic work and sharing an understanding of just how important the junior component of our club is. Tony in particular should be singled out for his work on transitioning our juniors into the seniors – so critical for our long term success.

Enormous thanks to all our junior coaches and commiserations to our U/15's and U/13's both of whom were just beaten in the Grand Finals. How exciting it is to have another crop of talented players making their way through the club.

Sadly in the coming season we say goodbye to the HDCA. The HCC was a founding member of this fantastic competition, which incidentally in the late 1960's, and 1970's consisted of over 40 clubs, and was twice the size of the old Eltham District Cricket Association out of the which the Diamond Valley Cricket Association was born.

The winds of change blow strongly it was necessary for our club to make the move and we enter the new competition with all principles and values intact and a strong desire to prove just how good a club we are on and off the field.

Lastly I would like to thank my family for allowing me to continue to fulfil my passion. As my son Lachlan and his friends begin to make their way through the junior ranks and into the seniors I am appreciating more than ever just how great this club is and the significant role and responsibility it has in developing and guiding people through those impressionable years and into adulthood.

The DVCA awaits.

TREASURER'S REPORT

It is with great pleasure I present the 2011/2012 financial statement of the Heidelberg Cricket Club.

In what is a difficult economic climate we defined the dooms dayers and clubs in recession by recording one of our best financial performances ever. This was due in part to significant assistance from our many valuable sponsors whose generous contributions enabled the club to operate successfully and continue our important role of developing young cricketers into not only great players but people as well.

I would like to thank John Gilham, Damien Noonan and Craig Bassett for their 'background' role in securing many of our new sponsors. We hope we can continue to grow this aspect of our operation as the injection of funds are incredibly important to us.

I would also like to thank Damien Noonan who assumed the role of membership and merchandise manager and implemented many new systems that enabled us to track both these important revenue streams far more accurately as the results can be seen in the P & L.

This year for the first time we utilised the services of an international player and we were really pleased with Lasith Fernando's input and performance at the club. The financial impost was minimal for the results attained so we can be pleased with that decision.

Some highlights of the financial year include;

- A 1,306% increase in sponsorship revenue
- A 22% increase in bar and canteen revenue
- A 135% increase in senior membership
- A 23% increase in junior membership despite a significant decrease in Milo subscriptions.
- A 237% increase in merchandise sales
- On revenue of \$123,000 we were able to achieve a net operating profit of 21.5%, or in dollar terms this represented an approximate turnaround of \$31,000 from the previous season.

Whilst some cost centres such as balls and utilities increased significantly others such as coaching fees remained stable once Lasith's fees are excluded from calculations.

The club is in a healthy position but needs to maintain and improve on existing sponsorship levels and needs to ensure growth in beverage and food revenue to remain viable. Despite the temptation to recruit heavily as we enter the DVCA, the club remains conservative (as it always has) in its approach to remunerating coaches and or any players it deems necessary.

We continue the need to service debt on our cricket nets and in the coming season will commence repayment of our portion of the debt on the new change rooms.



U/17 Gold Coach's Report

The season provided another opportunity for our list of U/17 players to improve themselves as cricketers individually and also as a team. A couple weeks prior to the season commencing Bluey, Banger and myself sat down and discussed the best way to structure our two sides, and ultimately we ended up with two competitive teams mixed of both top and bottom aged players.

With a few top aged players still remaining from the premiership side in the season prior, as well as the bottom agers coming in from the under 15s and some new recruits, we put together a team on paper that we believed was capable of continuing our dominance in the HDCA top aged age bracket in recent years.

Richard Skok, Ian Lobo and Sam Wilcox were our recruits from Ivanhoe Grammar and all played a role at different stages throughout the season. Sammy was named in the Calder Cannons U/18 TAC Cup squad, which while a great effort for him it meant that we would be without him after the first three rounds.

The season we had was very positive, finishing the home and away rounds in a well-earned top spot only losing one match against eventual runners-up East Ivanhoe. Appendix I

Trophy Winner Eligibility

Player must be a fully financial member of the Heidelberg Cricket Club.

First Grade Qualification Requirements -:

Batting - Minimum of 7 innings and 200 runs. Otherwise most runs. Bowling - Minimum of 500 balls. Otherwise most wickets.

All Other Senior Grades Qualification Requirements -:

Batting - Minimum of 5 innings and 200 runs. Otherwise most runs. Bowling - Minimum of 5 innings and 300 balls. Otherwise most wickets.

U/17 & U/15 Qualification Requirements -:

Batting - Minimum of 5 innings and 150 runs. Otherwise most runs Bowling - Minimum of 5 innings and 180 balls. Otherwise most wickets.

U/13 Qualification Requirements -:

Batting - Minimum of 5 innings and 100 runs. Otherwise most runs Bowling - Minimum of 5 innings and 120 balls. Otherwise most wickets.

Team Notations

In season 2011-12 the Heidelberg Cricket Club, in its 154th year, fielded 5 senior teams and 6 junior teams. The club also hosted a MILO program for approximately 15 kids aged 5-9 years old.

In the seniors, the club's 1st XI, 2nd XI, 3rd XI, 4th XI and 5th XI participated in the HDCA's First, Second, Third and Fourth Grades respectively.

In the juniors, as a general guide, the club's first year players in their age-group participated in the HDCA's Green competition, whilst second year players competed in the Gold competition. The Kookaburra's is for young players, generally under 10 years of age. No match results are recorded for the Kookaburras.

Additionally, the club once again conducted a 'Milo Cricket' program throughout the season. This 9 week program teaches children (aged 4 through 9) the skills of the game through various training drills and doesn't involve a fixtured competition. In 2011-12, some 15 children participated in the HCC's Milo Cricket-Have-A-Go program which was managed by Renato Dintinosante.
