This season proved to be a defining moment in the history of the Heidelberg Cricket Club. After Rosanna decided to end their association with the HDCA and join the DVCA, Banyule Cricket Club explored their options and decided to follow Rosanna. This series of events really gave the Heidelberg Cricket Club no option but to follow both clubs and the decision was made to join the DVCA.

It should be publicly noted that it was always the club's intention to remain a member of the HDCA but with the departure of the above-mentioned clubs and also critically, the decisions by Edinburgh CC and East Ivanhoe Saints CC to join the Eastern Cricket Association, the HCC was left no option but to seek admission to an alternative cricket association as effectively our lower X1's and in particular our juniors would have no one to play.

So we move to Money Shield, the DVCA second division with high expectations of making finals for the 16th consecutive season. Unfortunately, we were unable to regain the services of our Sri Lankan import Lasith Fernando due to family reasons and club legend Steve Favrin decided Rosebank CC was a better option for him. That really left a gaping hole in both our batting and bowling and the decision was made to recruit and persist with our highly talented youth. In a nutshell, our First X1 finished midway losing some games we never should have lost and copping a washout first game of the season to what would eventually prove to be the winless, bottom of the ladder Whittlesea.

Congratulations to our second X1, brilliantly led by veteran David Roberts who has the outstanding ability to manage both older and younger players, never forgetting that the younger players need to be exposed and develop their talents and this takes time.

To Tony Balcombe and his third X1 on winning the premiership I say a huge well done. To have Tony Balcombe lead a side of effectively juniors (excluding Gav Watson) to a premiership was a monumental performance and full credit to Banger who along with Debbie are a priceless asset to the club, not only for what he did and does with youth development but also his and Debbie's roles as Junior Managers of the club. I cannot thank them enough and every club member should also keep in mind that the time Banger puts into these young blokes will bear fruit for many years to come.

To Sam and Raj on looking after and leading our 4th and Fifth X1's I also say well done as both sides made the finals and Raj's side was unfortunately defeated in the Grand Final. Thanks to both of you for the roles you play in the club and best of luck to Raj who has moved to India for a period and he will be sorely missed by all at the club especially for his 'backroom' stuff he does such as entering scores and managing MyCricket.

The juniors entry into the DVCA proved a very wise move with a much larger pool of clubs to play against. We had Under 18's for the first time and we moved back to 'even' age groups for the first time in a decade.

I thank all the junior coaches/managers for devoting their time to training and match days, setting up grounds, umpiring dropping kids off, picking them up etc. I also congratulate Craig Ladd and his U/14 Yellow team who continued our great tradition of winning junior premierships with yet another pennant in a tightly fought grand final.

To Brad Grindal who lead the club as Captain Coach so well, especially in our entry into a new comp and I thank him firstly for sticking with us, when others didn't, for sharing the club's belief that a move to the DVCA was in the club's best LONG TERM interests and for absorbing so much pressure when things got a little tight towards the end of the season. It's now time to relax, enjoy your cricket and remember you always have a place you can call home.

Thanks especially to Steve Cashen who not only returned to play but regained his passion for coaching and teaching and recognising just how valuable our young talent is. Like many of us Cash is strong believer that we have the best 17 – 23 year old list in the entire DVCA.

We need to be patient and provide the right opportunities to develop our young players. After my 40 odd years involvement with the club there is still no greater JOY than seeing someone come through our under 12's and represent our First XI. It is the very essence of what we are about as a club.

I also wish to thank Russell Gardner, Banger of course, Noons, Brett Grindal and others who assisted Brad with coaching and providing the one-on-one attention that our young boys need and appreciate.

Thanks to all on the committee, in particular Vice Pres John Gilham who runs such a strong powerful and highly successful sponsorship program. To our other Vice Pres Damien Noonan thanks for managing the two M's merchandise and membership – two absolutely critical areas of revenue for the club, to Bluey for running such a successful and professional bar throughout the entire season and to Craig Stevens for ensuring the transition to the DVCA from an administration point of view was seamless.

There are many more I could mention because we have such a strong sense of club and a culture that makes the place so enjoyable to be around. From Gav with his joker jackpot, to Robbo and the punters club, to Haydon Woodhouse for all the odd jobs he does around the place, to Rennie and John and the others who put up with my orders on Thursday food nights, all those things are intertwined into what makes the HCC a great place to be.

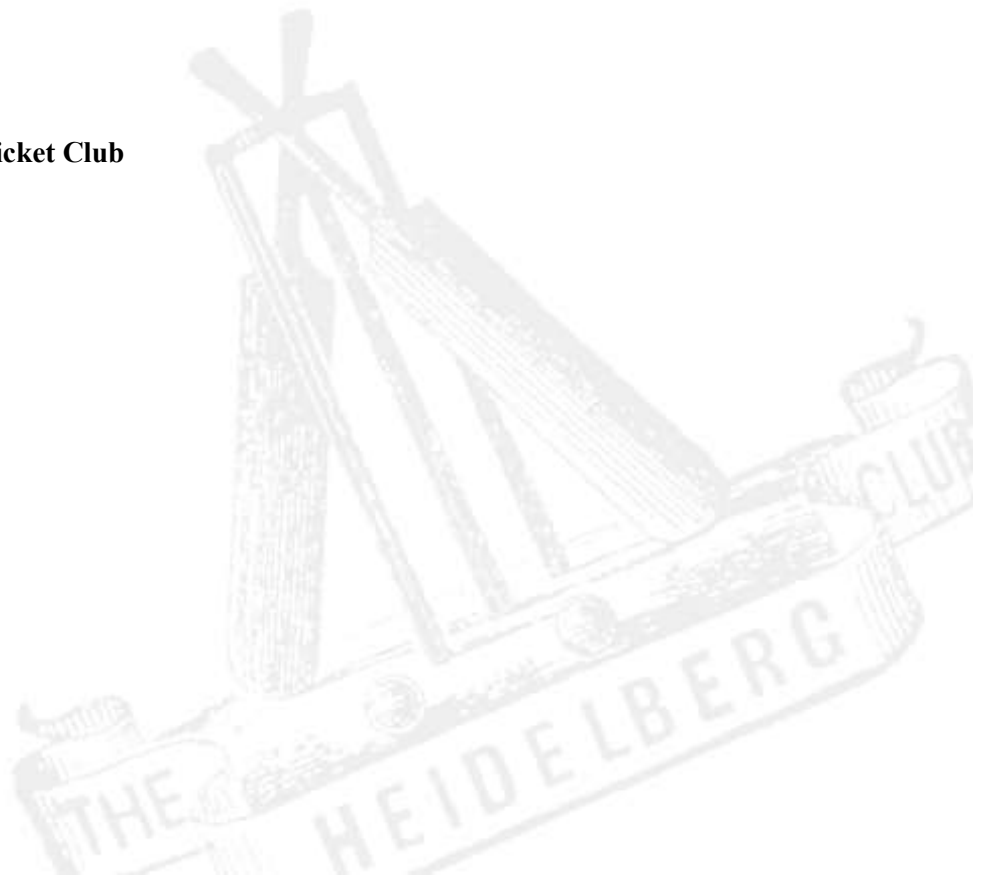

TREASURER'S REPORT

It is with pleasure that I present another favourable trading year for the Heidelberg Cricket Club. We are blessed to have so many volunteers who give up their time to make the club the financial success it is. We also have a number of part-time employees who fulfil their role superbly easing the burden on the bar and canteen. Thanks to Rita and Elissa.

A couple of key thankyou's are in order. To Bluey for his management of the bar and cleaning of the facility, the work he does and more importantly the respect he has for place is unbelievable and unmatched in the DVCA.

To our Vice Presidents, Damien Noonan and John Gilham enormous thanks should be forwarded to them for their work on the absolute other critical areas of operation – Membership, Merchandise and Sponsorship. To John and Craig Bassett especially who's background work on securing critical corporate financial support and sponsorship has once again enabled the club to produce a sizeable operating profit for 2012/2013.

It should be noted though that sponsors do not last forever and in tough economic times it is harder to extract monies for sponsorship. Without the level of sponsorship we are able to attain would make a significant dent in our operating profit, even taking into account capital expenditure on the ground and Warringal Park facility.

Key highlights of the year include;

- Revenue up 19% on the previous year
- Expenditure increased by 25% on the previous year
- We invested just over \$11,500 in capital improvements including a ½ share of a new centre wicket, improvements to our training nets, we paid for the new cool room compressor and we have commenced paying down the debt on the new change room facility.
- We continue to pay down our debt on the training nets with the amount now owing just \$7,651.00 from an original debt of \$35,000.
- We are holding \$4,610 in merchandise that can be sold this coming season. It should also be noted that part of the \$28,000 sponsorship included club new DVCA club playing shirts that every player received as part of the membership. This amount totalled \$3,600.

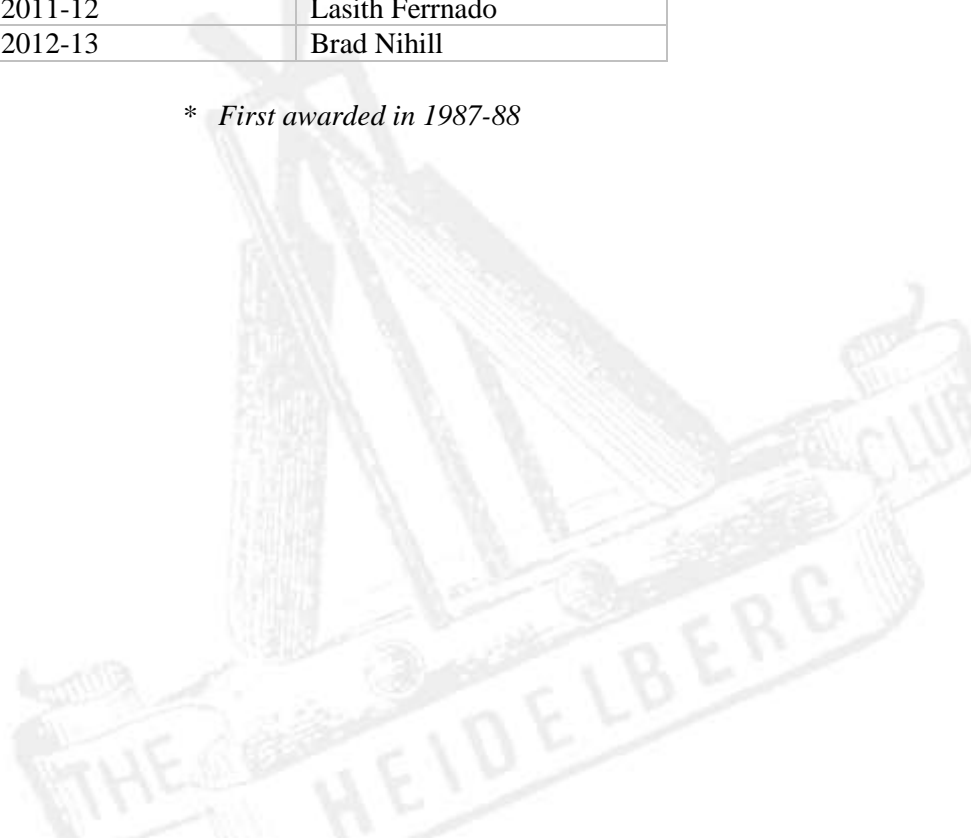
